

2nd Brazilian Artificial Intelligence Observatory Seminar

Concept Note

I. The Event

The second seminar organized by the Brazilian Artificial Intelligence Observatory (OBIA), coordinated by the Brazilian Network Information Center (NIC.br), the executive arm of the Brazilian Internet Steering Committee (CGI.br), will be held in conjunction with the Seminar on Privacy and Personal Data Protection organized by CGI.br and NIC.br. The events are scheduled from August 25 to 28, 2025, with the 28th dedicated entirely to the theme of Artificial Intelligence (AI).

The OBIA is part of Axis 5 — "Support for the Regulatory and Governance Process of Al" — of the Brazilian Artificial Intelligence Plan (PBIA), developed by the Ministry of Science, Technology and Innovation (MCTI). Its main goal is to monitor and assess the progress and impacts of Al initiatives in Brazil, serving as a repository of information, analyses, and indicators related to the development and adoption of Al applications.

In its second edition, the seminar aims to foster a qualified debate on the social impacts of Al in emerging areas such as labor, education, sustainable development, and privacy.

By engaging various stakeholders, including government representatives, civil society, and academia, the seminar promotes an inclusive and evidence-based dialogue on the societal impacts of Al. This approach contributes to ensuring that the benefits of Al are broadly shared while its potential risks are addressed collaboratively and responsibly.

II. Objectives

This edition of the OBIA Seminar seeks to broaden the understanding of artificial intelligence and its implications by bringing together a diverse audience of academic researchers, public policymakers, civil society representatives, business leaders, and professionals in the field. The seminar will feature national and international experts who will discuss the impacts of Al on the labor market, education, sustainable development, and the current model of information consumption on the web.

III. Agenda

Core topics to be addressed:

 Labor Market: Changes brought by AI in hiring, evaluation, and dismissal processes, as well as working conditions across different productive sectors. Topics such as HR



process automation, functional restructuring, job displacement, and the challenges of reskilling and upskilling may either exacerbate existing inequalities or become drivers of social justice and innovation.

- Education: The education sector is undergoing transformative changes due to the integration of AI into teaching and learning processes. This theme explores opportunities and ethical, pedagogical, and social dilemmas.
- Sustainable Development: How AI can be applied to sustainability and climate change, highlighting its positive potential as well as challenges related to high energy and resource consumption. The topic will consider Brazil's context and the opportunities and risks outlined in the PBIA.
- Al Agents and the Web Ecosystem: Understanding and addressing the impacts of Al on the web ecosystem. Al agents are changing how users consume and search for online content, creating challenges and opportunities for users, content providers, governments, and Al companies.
